

Dr. Francesca Lembo-Fazio

University of Rome La Sapienza

Francesca Lembo Fazio is an Italian early career scholar based in Rome, with a background in Architecture (BSc in 2010, MSc with honours in 2013). In 2017 she obtained a PhD in Conservation of Architecture from *La Sapienza* University of Rome, where she worked under the supervision of Prof. Giovanni Carbonara and Prof. Daniela Esposito. Her thesis, *Roma comunale e l'antiquitas tra XIII e XIV secolo*, studied the topography of Rome and how ruins and spolia were integrated in the roman urban layout during the Late Medieval and Early Modern time.

She teaches at the Conservation Design Studio for Urban Regeneration and "Organizzazione del Cantiere di Restauro" at *La Sapienza* University of Rome.

Since the academic year 2013-2014 she has been working as an associate tutor at the Department of Architecture (*La Sapienza* University of Rome). She participated in the research groups led by Professor Daniela Esposito ("Il 'frammento architettonico': limiti e finalità della reintegrazione fra restauro, ricomposizione materiale e restituzione virtuale") and by Professor Rossana Mancini, dedicated to the Roman Fora in the Imperial provinces. In 2016, she was awarded a scholarship for a short research mission at the École française de Rome on the subject "Les réemplois en architecture, entre Antiquité et Moyen Âge".
