FOREWORD

The practice of preservation has ancient roots. This is spanning from the reintegration of parts of objects, which are lacking integrity to the reconstruction of entire buildings. It also includes intermediary solutions such as the partial recomposition of heritage left in a state of Ruin and one of paintings which are showing extended lacunae. Despite the potential for disproportionate losses of heritage, this practice is regarded as crucial for the transmission of heritage to posterity. The symposium "From Fragment to Palimpsest: Ricomposizioni che narrano. Preservation, Reintegration, Recomposition, Reconstruction" offers a unique opportunity for debate, fostering a dialogue between restorers and architects on the effects of a century-long practice of manipulation of heritage so to preserve and transmit this to posterity. Renowned scholars coming from different countries and experts at national and international levels, who research and work in the field of heritage protection, are, here, taken together. This is aiming to explore new horizons in the preservation of our heritage and how this is staged for the future.

From Fragment to Palimpsest is also striving for finding a common ground for debate on dissonant and detested heritage.
